ILLEGAL MIGRATION

EMERGENCY ORDER

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2023, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 23-03

regarding illegal migration and declared a state of emergency for the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Executive Order 23-03 designated the Director of the

Division of Emergency Management as the State Coordinating Officer for the duration of

this emergency and delegated to the State Coordinating Officer the authority to exercise

those powers delineated in section 252.36(6)-(12), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.F. of Executive Order 23-03 and section

252.36(1)(a) and (6)(a), Florida Statutes, Governor DeSantis authorized the State

Coordinating Officer to suspend the effect of any statute, rule, or order that would in any

way prevent, hinder, or delay any mitigation, response, or recovery action necessary to

respond to this emergency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4.B. of Executive Order 23-03, each state agency

may suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for

conduct of state business or the orders or rules of that agency, if strict compliance with the

provisions of any such statute, order, or rule would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay

necessary action in coping with the emergency; and

WHEREAS, strict compliance with the provisions of section 401.25(2)(d), Florida

Statutes, section 401.251(4)(b), Florida Statutes, and Rules 64J.1.002(2)(b) and 64J-

1.003(1), (6)(c)3.–4., Florida Administrative Code, which require basic life support service providers, advanced life support service providers, and air ambulance services to hold a certificate of public convenience and necessity from each county in which they operate or are operating, would prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KEVIN GUTHRIE, pursuant to Sections 2 and 4 of Executive Order 23-03, and section 252.36(1)(a) and (6)(a), Florida Statutes, find that the Division's strict compliance with the following statutes and rules would prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency:

1) Section 401.25(2)(d), Florida Statutes, section 401.251(4)(b), Florida Statutes, and Rules 64J-1.002(2)(b) and 64J-1.003(1), (6)(c)3.-4., Florida Administrative Code, as they relate to the certification of basic life support service providers, advanced life support service providers, and air ambulance services.

Accordingly, for the duration of Executive Order 23-03, including any extensions thereof, and pursuant to the authority delegated to me thereby, I hereby suspend the effect of the above-referenced statutes and rules only as they pertain to the Division and only for the limited purpose of facilitating the Division's response to this emergency.

This Order is effective immediately and shall expire on the same date that Executive Order 23-03 expires, to include any extensions thereto.
